Hybrid, Virtual & In Person Meetings So many Choices

As of June 11, 2021, the City of Philadelphia eased many of the pandemic restrictions that forced many of us out of work and out of meetings. While some have adapted to the new normalcy of virtual meetings, others have struggled with the new normalcy. A few homegroups have been forced with the decision to relocate their physical meeting space. A few groups have had to wrestle with surrender of their meeting space because other groups have expressed interest in the meeting space. The thing that compounds all of these decisions is that, while this pandemic seemed to be getting under control, new variants of covid-19 have emerged to present another level of concern for those vaccinated amongst the 58% in the city and the 42% that still are not vaccinated at the time of this article. There are more options for meetings now. We will attempt to bring everyone up to speed with the meeting options that are currently available. Hybrid meetings (which is a new term in NA) consists of a physical meeting and a virtual meeting combined. These meetings can function different ways. 1. The physical meeting chooses a virtual meeting space to broadcast the physical meeting. 2. The physical meeting and the virtual meeting may meet at the same time without any virtual broadcast of the physical meeting. There are also groups that have chosen to leave the virtual realm and present physical meetings only, while other groups see the importance of staying in the virtual realm for the time being. It then becomes an individual preference as to what meeting will work with the individual's current lifestyle. Remember we are a program of choice.

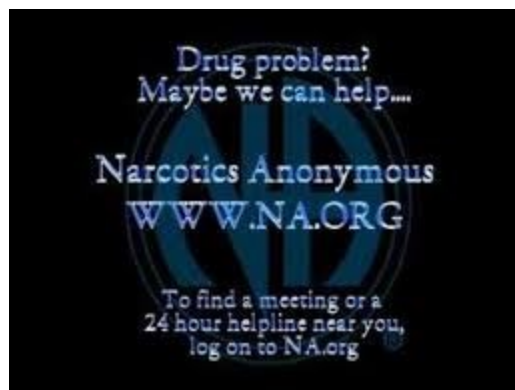

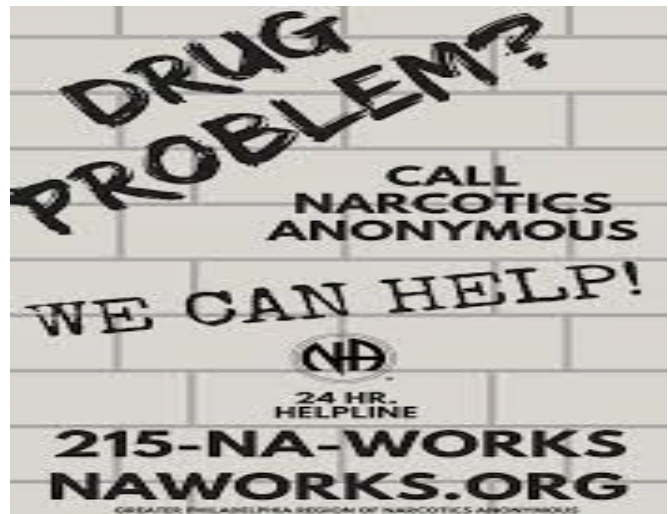

OUR ORIGINAL CONTRIBUTIONS PORTAL IS STILL ACTIVE, AND IF YOU WANT YOUR CONTRIBUTION ATTRIBUTED TO A SPECIFIC GROUP OR SERVICE BODY, YOU SHOULD USE THE ORIGINAL PORTAL [HTTPS://WWW.NA.ORG/?ID=DONATIONEXTERNAL-INDEX](https://www.na.org/?ID=DONATIONEXTERNAL-INDEX). REQUESTS FOR SERVICES FROM THE FELLOWSHIP HAD BEEN OUTPACING OUR ABILITY TO FUND THEM ONLY FROM LITERATURE SALES BEFORE THE PANDEMIC BEGAN. WE HAD INCLUDED AN INVEST IN OUR VISION (IIOV) STRATEGY IN OUR PLAN FOR THE UPCOMING CYCLE. THE AIM WAS TO INCREASE AWARENESS AND ENCOURAGE DIALOGUE ABOUT WHAT IS REQUIRED TO PURSUE A VISION FOR NA SERVICE AND THE INCREASED COMMITMENT TO SELF-SUPPORT NEEDED TO ACHIEVE IT. THIS IS ABOUT BOTH THE HUMAN AND FINANCIAL RESOURCES NEEDED AT NA WORLD SERVICES AND SERVICE BODIES AROUND THE WORLD TO MAKE OUR MESSAGE AVAILABLE AND OUR VISION A REALITY, WHICH IS WHY WE HAVE CALLED IT INVEST IN OUR VISION. THE RECENT WORLD CHANGES HAVE SIMPLY SERVED TO HEIGHTEN THAT NEED. THE RESPONSE HAS BEEN AMAZING. THANK YOU SEEMS INADEQUATE TO EXPRESS OUR HEARTFELT GRATITUDE FOR THE EFFORTS OF SO MANY MEMBERS. BY THE BEGINNING OF MAY, WE HAD RECEIVED OVER \$70,000 THROUGH THE NEW CONTRIBUTE PAGE. BEFORE THE SHUT DOWN, WE HAD APPROXIMATELY 50 RECURRING CONTRIBUTIONS FROM MEMBERS, AND THESE RECURRING CONTRIBUTIONS TOTALLED ABOUT \$2,089 PER MONTH. AS OF THE END OF APRIL, THIS HAS INCREASED TO 310 MEMBERS WITH RECURRING CONTRIBUTIONS TOTALING ABOUT \$8,091 PER MONTH. OUR GRATITUDE TO ALL WHO WERE ABLE AND CHOOSE TO CONTRIBUTE AND INVEST IN OUR VISION. TO CONTRIBUTE, SIMPLY PRESS THE NA SYMBOL IN THE HEART, (PICTURED ABOVE). NA WORLD SERVICES UPDATE

IN SPITE OF THE REDUCTION IN STAFF AND INCOME, A LOT HAS STILL BEEN HAPPENING ON YOUR BEHALF AT NA WORLD SERVICES. WE HAVE POSTED OVER 50 PIECES OF RECOVERY LITERATURE AND SERVICE MATERIAL IN 16 LANGUAGES, MUCH OF IT NEWLY APPROVED TRANSLATIONS, TO NA.ORG SINCE MARCH 18TH. THIS AMOUNT OF ACTIVITY WOULD BE IMPRESSIVE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES, BUT ESPECIALLY NOW, GIVEN OUR REDUCED STAFF. WE HAVE ALSO BEEN ABLE TO ADD TRANSLATED EBOOKS AVAILABLE THROUGH COMMERCIAL PORTALS: [WWW.NA.ORG/ELIT](http://www.na.org/elit). WE HAVE ALSO POSTED AUDIO VERSIONS OF THE BASIC TEXT AT [HTTPS://WWW.NA.ORG/?ID=BT-AUD](https://www.na.org/?ID=BT-AUD) IN HUNGARIAN, ARABIC, AND RUSSIAN. ALL ARE AVAILABLE TO STREAM OR DOWNLOAD AT NO COST. WE ARE CURRENTLY WORKING ON SPANISH AND HOPE TO POST BOTH SPANISH AND ENGLISH SOON. WE HAVE PUT A PAUSE ON ALL PAPER PUBLICATIONS, BECAUSE OF BOTH THE COST AND HUMAN RESOURCES NEEDED FOR PAPER MAILINGS. WE WILL CONTINUE TO WORK ON ONLINE PUBLICATIONS, AS WE ARE ABLE. WE ARE BEGINNING TO RESPOND TO MAIL RECEIVED FROM INCARCERATED MEMBERS. THE PROTECTION OF THE NA MESSAGE IS A RESPONSIBILITY ENTRUSTED TO US BY THE FELLOWSHIP THAT WE TAKE SERIOUSLY. THAT RESPONSIBILITY, AND THE RATHER SIGNIFICANT EXPENSES THAT COME WITH IT AROUND THE WORLD, ARE ONGOING, AND WE HAVE TO ENSURE THAT FUNDS CONTINUE TO REMAIN AVAILABLE TO COVER THIS RESPONSIBILITY. IN ADDITION TO REGULAR TRADEMARK REGISTRATIONS, COPYRIGHTS, AND RENEWALS THAT ARE ONGOING RESPONSIBILITIES, WE HAVE ALSO BEEN DRAWN INTO LEGAL CHALLENGES INVOLVING EITHER THE NA NAME OR THE CONTENT OF NA LITERATURE IN RUSSIA AND THE PHILIPPINES. IN ADDITION, WE HAVE A JULY COURT DATE FOR A LEGAL PETITION FILED IN THE US. SINCE THESE ARE ALL CURRENT LEGAL ISSUES, THERE IS NOT A LOT MORE WE CAN SAY AT THIS TIME.

Dear Addict,

My best friend in recovery is marrying an addict that has had past abuse in relationship issues with other women. I am aware that I can't stop the wedding but how do I help her see that this is very unhealthy for her?

Don't want my friend to die

Dear Don't want my friend to die,

Who is to say that this man hasn't changed. The first things that come to mind are tolerance and patience. If your friend has been made aware of the past history, there is the chance that she herself decided to practice some spiritual principles in the process. It is not our job to judge but rather be there as friend that NA has groomed us to be. The Just for today daily meditation that talks about forgiveness reminds us that we are all human and that mistakes don't define us. Talk to friend with love and concern and let her know that you will support her and if things go sour you will still be there to help her heal.

Dear Addict,

I am in an unhealthy relationship and don't know how to end it because I feel as if 5 years is a long term investment in a person. I do love the person still but question my own motives for staying because of the invested time that we have in this relationship. How do I end this relationship without causing harm?

Don't want to cause harm

Dear Don't want to cause harm,

As a person who came into recovery in a relationship, I understand the dilemma. I went to meetings and talked about my feelings. I heard someone in a meeting say "If the pain of holding on is greater than letting go, then I need to look at the pain evaluate the pain and make a healthy decision" The real part was healthy decision. How do we as addicts make healthy decisions? We must start by doing things that are healthy for our recovery. One key thing that I did learn was never to go to single people with relationship issues. Ninety-nine percent of the time we will get single information with can be harmful. Talk to your Sponsor and then get enough spiritual direction to make a decision.

A MATTER OF CONCEPTS

8th Concept

"Our service structure depends on the integrity and effectiveness of our communications."

Our fellowship's service structure is founded on the unity of our groups; to maintain that union, we must have regular communications throughout Narcotics Anonymous. Together, our groups have created a service structure to meet their common needs and to help them fulfill their common purpose. The effectiveness of the service structure depends on the continued unity of the NA groups, and on their continued support and direction. These things can only be maintained in an atmosphere of honest, open, and straightforward communication among all parties concerned. Regular communication plays a large part in the fulfillment of our groups' final responsibility and authority for NA services. Through their GSRs, the groups regularly report their strengths, needs, ideas, and conscience to the service structure. Taken together, these group reports give our service boards and committees clear guidance in their efforts to serve NA as a whole. When the groups are regularly given full and accurate information from all elements of the service structure, they become familiar with the structure's normal patterns of activity. The groups are then able to recognize when something goes wrong with one of our service boards and committees, and are in a better position to know how to help correct the problem. And, knowing what kinds of resources are needed to fulfill service tasks, our groups are also more likely to provide the service structure with adequate support. Clear, frequent two-way communication is an important prerequisite for delegation. When our groups ask the service structure to fulfill certain responsibilities on our behalf, we delegate to the structure the authority needed to make decisions related to those responsibilities. We need to be able to trust our trusted servants before we can confidently delegate them that degree of authority. That kind of trust depends in large part on continuing communication. So long as our service boards and committees regularly issue complete, candid reports of their activities, we can be confident that we have delegated our authority wisely. Open and frank communication is a critical ingredient of effective leadership. To better know the ideas, wishes, needs, and conscience of those they serve, trusted servants must listen carefully to their fellowship. To give the NA groups the information they need to guide and support our services, NA leaders regularly distribute full, unequivocal reports. We do not want our trusted servants to constantly inundate us with every fact and figure possible, though we do expect them to provide us with complete information on all their activities and discussions if we ask for it. In communicating with those they serve, trusted servants demonstrate an open attitude, one that is inclusive, inviting, and clearly influence able. Such openness and forthrightness may be uncomfortable, but is essential in maintaining the integrity of our services. Finally, full and frequent communication is essential in the development of group conscience, the spiritual means by which we invite the influence of a loving God in making our collective decisions. To develop group conscience, communications must be honest and direct. Without the full picture, seen from all sides, our groups, service boards, and committees cannot develop an informed group conscience.

When we gather together to consider service issues, we openly share ideas and information with one another, frankly speaking our minds and hearts on the matter at hand. We listen closely to one another, considering carefully the information and insights we've heard; we consult our individual consciences on the matter; then, we make a decision. A conscience fed on ignorance is an ineffective conscience, incapable of providing reliable guidance. An effective conscience can develop only in an atmosphere of regular, open communication among all parties concerned. The purpose of our services is to help our fellowship fulfill its primary purpose: to carry the message to the addict who still suffers. Honest, open, straightforward communication is essential to both the integrity and the effectiveness of the NA service structure. Unity, group responsibility and authority, delegation, leadership, accountability, group conscience, participation—all depend on good communication among the various elements of the NA Fellowship. With regular two-way communication, our groups and our services are well positioned to uphold the ideals and fulfill the responsibilities described in our Twelve Concepts.
